



### 20 YEARS AGO

Twenty years ago the small grade II\* listed building in the churchyard had its roof rethatched, National Lottery gave a grant of ten thousand pounds with the stipulation that the church must start saving for the next re-thatch. During the past twenty years many cups of coffee, many cakes, sales of books, gift cards, donations, gifts, a wedding festival, flower festivals. And the list goes on, the fund grew to the almost double that 20 year old figure. So many readers of The Link and Parish News have contributed towards this new thatch which has started, or is about to start, depending of the date you read this issue. 26 August being the given start date. Let's hope for good weather for the thatchers who have to use combed wheat straw - it's a listed building so can't change to reed! What next? Initially voluntary help from any home decorator with a little spare time would be so appreciated to paint the walls with lime wash and the woodwork needs a coat of paint. Damp has penetrated the walls in places causing problems to the plaster. More when the full extent is known.

**THEN** A start has already been made with the 'In an English Country Garden' day in July, and this is being followed by 'Afternoon Cream Tea' on 13 September – see the notice above.

The author of Ecclesiastes in the Bible writes:

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven."

Some readers might remember that this was the refrain to the song 'Turn! Turn! Turn: To everything there is a season', made popular in the 1960s by The Byrds.

Ecclesiastes forms one of the 'Wisdom' books in the Bible along with Psalms, Proverbs, The Song of Songs, and the Book of Job. Although it is not often read in church, it is the source of many of the sayings still used today such as "Cast your bread upon the waters" and "every evil under the sun". It is also about life and how uncertain life can be, but whatever is thrown at us, what matters is how we respond to both the good and the challenges. Pain and suffering are also an inevitable part of being human. Similarly, whilst we are encouraged to enjoy the gifts that God gives us, we do well to remember that success or wealth can all be taken from us in an instance.

What Christians believe is that "to those who love God, who are called according to his plan, everything that happens fits into a pattern for good". In other words, even those who love God and are doing their best to obey his commands know that bad/sad/evil/wicked things will happen to us. However, we believe that ultimately God will use them to bring about good, both in our lives and in the world.

Talking of there being a season for everything, this month Tony and I will be saying "goodbye" to Hexworthy and our Mission Community and moving to Suffolk. When we moved here, we had no idea what God had in mind for us regarding first, St. Raphel's Chapel and then St. Mary's Church, and we will miss the people of both churches.

This gives me the opportunity to say "thank you" to past and present Parochial Church Council (PCC) members and volunteers who supported me during my time as Churchwarden. Since the refurbishment of St. Mary's in 2022, it has been good to see the building used more by different groups. St Raphael's has also grown as a place of pilgrimage and prayer as well as a tourist attraction.

Parish churches belong to the people of the parish, not just those who choose to worship there. I believe it would be good for the church to have people who may not 'come to church', but who value the buildings and the churchyards to join the PCC and bring other perspectives to the day to day running and future planning for St. Mary's and St. Raphael's. It is not an onerous task with three to four meetings a year, but an important one.

I know that under the stewardship of Rebecca and the support of Marilyn at Huccaby, the churches are in very good hands, but both of them and the PCC, deserve and need the continuing support of our local communities to maintain these valuable and precious community assets. Is God calling you?

### Music at St Raphael's

"Music expresses that which cannot be said and on which it is impossible to be silent." - Victor Hugo "Music is the mediator between the spiritual and the sensual life." - Ludwig van Beethoven.

On 24<sup>th</sup> July the chapel hosted an imaginative Night Music concert by world-class string quartet musicians, promoted as part of the Ashburton Chamber Music Festival: "New this year is a *Nachtmusik*—an hour or so of music in a small venue on Dartmoor, close to nature, performed in near darkness, with no chat or applause — a very beautiful and meditative experience". The hugely successful event certainly lived up to its billing. To inspire further musical events at St Raphael's, it is worth noting: the

Chapel's dedication to Archangel Raphael; the distinctive ambience of the building; and the impact of community collaborations.

In commenting "Music is well said to be the speech of angels." the American poet Longfellow was echoing all the Abrahamic faiths. Jewish tradition says that angels constantly sing songs of praise to God. The Christian tradition routinely portrays angels playing musical instruments. Islamic tradition specifically describes Archangel Raphael as a Master of Music who will blow a horn to announce Judgment Day (see illustration). Festival Artistic Director David Yang was inspired to bring this classical concert to St Raphael's by the chapel's special ambience. People often comment on the rural setting and the tranquillity of the simple interior, with its single white, light-flooded space and the steep elevation of its roof. When empty, the building has some echo, but the acoustics were greatly improved by the 112 bodies of our capacity audience!

As well as David Yang and his musicians, we are very grateful to Andy Williamson of Ashburton Arts Centre and his team for the carefulness and efficiency with which they set up the concert and then returned the Chapel to its previous state. A donation from the Festival will help with Chapel maintenance. The concert will have introduced the Chapel and the Forest Inn to many new visitors: staff at the latter went out of their way to cater for the audience before and after the event.

Never before, in its 157 years, will the chapel have resounded to music of such intricacy, interweaving call and response, and such expressive range, from agony



### Come and play an organ!

You may have seen (and hopefully heard) the new organ we have installed in the church. It has just completed its 12 month "probation", and has been fully handed over to us by the organ builder, Martin Renshaw.

Following a visit by him we now have the "old" organ up and running in a barn (now known as the "organ loft") at Northway Farm, just up Widecombe Hill on the left. We are making it available to be played by anyone who would like to, by prior arrangement.

The instrument was built in 1830 and later added to, and would have been installed in a private residence - common practice in those days apparently, but certainly somewhat unusual these days! It is a simple instrument, all mechanically operated apart from the air supply, which is a great relief.

Miles Fursdon used to pump the organ by hand whilst his mother played it, and is now the owner of the original wooden lever. We have not replaced the walnut organ case, so that you can see inside and learn how the organ works.

If you would like to have a go, drop our organist Michael Brown an email:

mikebrown007@hotmail.com to arrange a time. He will introduce you to the instrument and leave you to it: he is not offering organ lessons, so bring your own music if you have any, or you can borrow his. No previous experience is necessary, and you don't have to be able to read music. We are told the organ sounds great in the small acoustic of the barn, particularly when played softly. It also sounds impressive when you pull out all the stops: almost enough to knock the cyclists off their bikes when they come whizzing down the hill!

Michael will be giving two short organ recitals on **Widecombe Fair Day in St Pancras Church, at 11am and 3pm**, so do come and hear the St Pancras organ then.






# Tuesday 23 September at 2.30 pm "Thomas the Tank Engine Man", Talk by Veronica Chambers, Ashburton Town Hall

Veronica, daughter of the Rev Wilbert Awdry tells the background and story of 'The Thomas the Tank Engine Man'...the modest parish priest, husband, father grandfather and writer of the stories which are well known and among today's classics.

Wilbert's father was a parish priest in Ampfield and many of his parishioners were GWR men, so



there was regular contact with railways, and those who worked on them. A move in 1920 to a house in Box, Wilts, near the famous Box tunnel, brought close daily proximity to the sight and sound of trains, and probably gave the boy of 9 the idea of talking trains...as indeed steam engines all sound different.

In early 1943, stories were made up to amuse brother Christopher, 2 1/2 recovering from measles...

The long step from these tales told to eventual print, family input, books, TV-wide Thomas effect, the boost for Heritage Railways and steam, and for railway

modelling in general... up to today when Thomas is known worldwide, and become a kind of means of uniting people all over the world.

### Part of the story.

We drove into the mist on Dartmoor, a colleague and I, and entered a grey damp world of grey, damp sheep, grazing alongside the road. It was a welcome wetness and the misty rain hung around for most of the day. That was no matter as we were inside the fifteenth century Church House at Widecombe. That building itself would have a tale or two to tell, but not for this day.

This day we were at the invitation of the Widecombe History Group who were holding an open visitor session in this historic building. The welcome had the added attraction of tea and scones, coffee and pasties.

Inside the ancient hall were various displays. A large table full of old photographs of village life, school life, country life. A fascinating

display of how from a collection of documents they had been given, plus further research, the history group had pieced together a fascinating timeline of a local boy who went to sea in Victorian times, finally coming to his demise in the Great War. And of course, a display in connection to Widecombe Fair, uncle Tom Cobley and all.

Our task had been to share something of the story of Elizabeth Braund, her faith and what led her to Dartmoor and so on. We headed it 'Elizabeth Braund, a Christian pioneer'. Our introduction was that she had come to Widecombe in 1975 with a van load of young people and never left. Since then thousands of young people have visited the farm at East Shallowford and experienced the life on the moor. She is buried in the church graveyard, not far from her colleague Rosemary.

For us as we talked with people it was a rich oral history experience. The couple who lived next door to Elizabeth in the first year at Bag Park Manor. The lady who recalls Elizabeth turning up to her farm with a van full of children to choose a couple of pigs, and to her surprise when asked where she should put the pigs, was told 'put them in the back with the children, we've only a couple of miles to go'. The farmer of several generations, who kept asking about Elizabeth and Rosemary's faith and motivation for all those years of working with young people.

Our own history display of course had many pictures as well. The ones that stand out for me are the ones with a sense of wonder breaking across the faces of the young people. There is Joe in the lambing shed, holding between his hands a newly-born lamb, and his eyes are almost popping out of his face with surprise. There are the two girls leaning over the railings of a steel hurdle fence and looking, possibly at a calf. One is pointing to something. Their heads are close to each other, as if sharing a secret or something special. The eyes are studied and opening wider, and the one pointing is saying something. I would like to have heard it. At the least it is 'look at that' but I can bet it is something deeper and fuller of surprise.

There have been 50 years of surprises, because this autumn marks Elizabeth and Rosemary coming to Widecombe with that first minibus of young people, and 2026 will mark 50 years at East Shallowford. We will be celebrating.

Watch this space and visit us at Widecombe Fair in the main field and also the pop-up café in Church House.
