Dear Friends,

My one-year pilgrimage: walking 12,000+ steps a day in aid of Devon Historic Churches

The UK is seeing a resurgence of interest in pilgrimage, with many historic routes and sites experiencing renewed popularity. This revival is driven by a desire for spiritual growth, connection with nature and a sense of community. Pilgrims are drawn to the UK's beautiful landscapes and sacred sites, as well as historic churches and cathedrals.

Since 1st December 2024 I am walking at least 12,000 steps (9+ kilometres) a day to raise funds for the Devon Historic Churches Trust. I hope to continue reaching my daily target of 12,000+ steps until the Feast of Epiphany on 6th January 2026 (that's a full year of hard walking).

I am passionate about conservation and preservation of Devon's beautiful historic churches. Too often we take our priceless heritage for granted, not realising all the many benefits historic churches and chapels bring to local communities and the UK economy.

As Churchill said in 1943: "we shape our buildings and afterwards our buildings shape us." In a way, historic churches can be considered more accessible than traditional museums and art galleries, in the sense that they are both living monuments and useful spaces, acting as bridges between the past and present - inspiring us to look into the past and immerse ourselves in the present moment; helping us build a better, more sustainable future.

Volunteers throughout Devon are giving their time and talents every day to deliver the services that every community needs; but the considerable costs of repairs are almost always beyond their resources. This is why supporting the Devon Historic Churches Truest is so important, so that we can preserve our historic churches – for everyone, and for ever.

Supporting Devon Air Ambulance and Holne Community Projects



Attention all Owners and Occupiers of Roadside Land!

Did you know that it is a legal responsibility of landowners or occupiers adjacent to public roads to maintain their hedges and trees? It is a popular misconception that this is the duty of Devon County Council. But - not so!

Our farmers largely do a good job of trimming their roadside hedges annually. Unfortunately, many other landowners large and small, forestry estates and innumerable private field and garden owners fail to address this responsibility, probably in ignorance of the law. As a result, high-sided vehicles are sometimes damaged and often caused to swerve away from overhanging branches with potential for head-on collisions. Lorry and trailer loads of hay and straw are dragged through overgrown hedges and low branches, plucking off bales or so damaging them that they arrive depleted and reduced in value. Meanwhile, road drains become blocked with the fallen debris. I understand that locally, some hauliers refuse to use routes to certain farms needing feed or bedding because of the probable damages caused by uncut hedges and overhanging branches.

Autumn is the time for landowners and occupiers to inspect their road boundaries. (Tenants may be required by their landlords to take responsibility, so check this.) Assess what needs to be done this winter, and in subsequent years. Which hedges need an annual cut? If there are years of accumulated growth, which need a radical cut back by shape-saw and clearing?

Harvest and Michaelmas

The Harvest Festival Service at St Raphael's takes place on Sunday October 19th at 3pm. All are welcome

Most of us will be familiar with the annual Harvest Festival, in a tradition that goes back thousands of years, as an opportunity to come together and give thanks for the natural bounty of Creation upon which we all depend.

Less well-known is the other Autumn Christian festival, of Michaelmas, on 29th September. The name Michaelmas comes from a shortening of "Michael's Mass", in the same style as Christmas (Christ's Mass) and Candlemas (Candle Mass, the Mass where traditionally the candles to be used throughout the year would be blessed). Michaelmas is also known as the **Feast of Saints Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael,** the Feast of the Archangels, or the Feast of Saint Michael and All Angels.

Not at all far from us at **St Raphael**'s, our sister chapel in Postbridge is dedicated to **St Gabriel**. Then on the western edge of the moor at Brentor, the church is dedicated to **St Michael**. Such a close celestial triangulation, giving such small places such mighty and linked patrons! Our claim to have a full house of Archangels locally, which must be a unique spiritual geography because there is no other Anglican St Raphael's in the country, is however complicated because there is a fourth angel, **Uriel**, recognised as an Archangel in the Anglican tradition. If a new church or chapel were to be founded on Dartmoor, you would not have to look far for an appropriate dedication...

One of the few flowers coming into bloom at this time of year is the Michaelmas daisy (also known as asters). Hence the rhyme: "The Michaelmas daisies, among dead weeds, Bloom for St Michael's valorous deeds". My own birthday is toward the end of September, so I always look forward to the arrival of the Michaelmas daisies, with their slender mauve petals radiating from a bright yellow centre. I suspect



that for many of us our favourite season is the one in which we were born.



All roadside trees should be regularly inspected for health and condition. Particular attention should be given to diseased elms or ash dieback victims. If you are not confident of your knowledge, have your boundaries regularly inspected by a qualified land agent, forester, arboricultural expert or tree surgeon. There are many experts and contractors that can help, several advertise in this magazine. For information on hedges look up the Devon hedge group: https://devonhedges.org/

At the minimum, hedges should be trimmed from the edge of the tarmac. Hedges and trees should be cut back to maintain minimum height clearances for roads and other public rights of way, allowing for next year's summer growth. These are:

- 5.2m (17'1") clearance for hedges and trees overhanging roads.
- 2.1m (6'11") clearance for hedges and trees overhanging footpaths.
- 2.5m (8'2") clearance for hedges and trees overhanging bridleways and cycleways.

If you take your measuring rod or tape measure along your road boundary (take care for traffic), you may be shocked by how much your hedges and trees fall short of these legal requirements.





Widecombe Church House and Lands Charity

It was decided at our AGM that Widecombe Church House and Lands Charity (WCHLC) would donate £2,500 to the Church and an identical sum to the Widecombe Educational Foundation (WEF).

The Trustees of the Charity also thought they would explain a bit more about the history of the Charity and its current role.

The Charity was established in 1635. As its title suggests, it was established to supervise the management of the Church House, land and property owned by the Charity. The original Benefactors showed great forethought in providing income for education and the relief of poverty in the parish at this time. The Church House itself was disposed of in 1877 after the Education Act of 1872, when it became Widecombe-in-the-



Moor School. The Charity's principal assets now are 1-4 Church Cottages at Dunstone, which are all let to local people.

The Charity has six Trustees in total. The Vicar of Widecombe-in-the-Moor, two Church Wardens, two appointees of the Widecombe PCC and one person appointed by Devon County Council, who oversee the aforementioned upkeep and management of the cottages. Additionally they can, where appropriate and there is a need, agree to let the cottages to local people at below market rent. When a cottage becomes vacant for any reason, this vacancy is advertised locally.

The Trustees give their time on a voluntary basis and thus overall a small surplus is usually seen each year. This is the money that is distributed to the Church and WEF, with these beneficiaries being formally defined in the constitution registered with the Charities Commission.

Leading on from this, the Charity Commission is keen to see the Trustees demonstrate good financial management. In this regard, the Trustees also ensure that a reasonable reserve is held in case any bigger repairs and the like are needed.

This is a very potted history and a little bit about how the Charity works in 2025.

Do not be pressured into doing something, things are rarely that urgent and if so would not be sent via email, scammers will use urgency as a tactic. Also, feel free to get in touch with a member of the clergy or admin team if you are unsure if an email is genuine.

We also managed the parking once again at the RAF Harrowbeer 1940s Weekend. With improved arrangements this year, everything went smoothly.





The journey.

It is Saturday 25th October 1975. Outside Providence House. Elizabeth Braund and Rosemary Bird are waiting. At 7.30am the young people begin to arrive. They start to load the three-ton lorry with all the boxes and items of equipment that were not loaded on Friday evening. Lois, from a local youth project arrives at 8am. She has offered to drive a van. There is no sign of Danny. He has offered to drive the truck, and the van is fully loaded, ready to go. Everyone has arrived except Danny and Junior. Junior is a local lad, about fifteen years old, and full of energy – if he arrives. Meanwhile, Elizabeth and Rosemary leave to pick





up the rental van. At 9.30, we are ready to go. Junior has arrived, but no Danny. We leave without him. One lorry, one rental van, one Providence white transit.

'It is an uneventful drive to Stonehenge for the usual stop. Somehow Lois misses us, and it is not until Honiton that we catch up with her, and rendezvous for a late lunch break.

'At 4.30pm we arrive at Bag Park Manor, Widecombe. Our local friend Sylvia is there to greet us, eyes streaming, as every fire in the house is smoking and the house is thick with smoke-fog.

'Unloading is quickly done, and things stowed in their rooms. At this point Danny arrives – by train and taxi. This is very much a new day. Perhaps a new era.'

The words of Elizabeth Braund in 1975.

It is Monday 18th August 2025. It is 9.30am outside Providence House. Almost 50 years later. Tracy and Elias, Maria and Val are waiting, and families begin to arrive. There will be 27 people in all, representing family groups. Two minibuses, both lent by friendly partner organisations. No-one is missing and nobody is late, and we are off before 10.30. There is a quiet excitement. Some have been before. For some it is a new adventure. It is the fourth group from Providence House this year, but who can count the number of times loaded minibuses have drawn out of the car park to make their way westwards since that Saturday morning in 1975.

But we are here. Not of course at Bag Park Manor. That was only the beginning. East Shallowford Farm – home until Thursday morning. May God have granted a blessed, harmonious, learning experience.

'O God, our help in ages past, our hope for years to come, our shelter from the stormy blast and our eternal home.'

The story goes on. On Monday 15th September a new team member started at Shallowford, Emily, as Volunteer Coordinator to open up new opportunities for us. On Monday 22nd of September, the first of seven weeks of Plymouth primary schools' visits arrived to take part in a residential farm experience.

50 years may have almost past, but the story goes on.
